

**INTER-DISTRICT ATTENDANCE**

The Governing Board recognizes that students who reside in one district may choose to attend school in another district and that such choices are made for a variety of reasons.

*(cf. 5116.1 – Intra-district Open Enrollment)*

The Board desires to communicate with parents/guardians and students regarding the district's educational programs and services.

The Board recognizes that students who reside in one district may choose to attend school in another district and that such choices are made for a variety of reasons. The Board desires to communicate with parents/guardians and students regarding the educational programs and services that are available.

The Board recognizes that the district may be capable of serving additional students. Therefore, the Superintendent or designee may approve inter-district attendance agreements with other districts and will consider approving such transfers only on a case-by-case basis through an inter-district attendance agreement.

The Superintendent or designee may deny inter-district attendance permits because of overcrowding within district schools or limited district resources.
