ADULT EDUCATION

BP 6200

The Governing Board recognizes that education is a lifelong process and that it is important for individuals to continuously develop new skills.

The Superintendent or designee shall develop and oversee the District's adult education program. The Board shall approve all courses to be offered in this program.

The Board of Education approves and encourages the adult education program for the members of the Folsom Cordova Unified School District. Classes shall be open for admission to adults and such minors as in the judgment of the Board of Education may be qualified.

Classes may be held at any hour of the day or evening. (California Education Code, section 52505)

Classes may be held at any place in the District having suitable facilities, subject to the approval of the Board of Education.

Course offerings may be academic, vocational or avocational. They may not include dancing, recreational physical education, or classes for the sole purpose of occupying the leisure time of the individuals. (California Education Code, section 52518)

Tuition fees may be charged for adults in accordance with provisions of the California Education Code except that no tuition fees shall be charged for adults enrolled in classes for which high school credit towards a high school diploma is granted, citizenship classes for the foreign born, English classes or classes in elementary subjects. (California Education Code, section 52612)

The Folsom Cordova Unified School District is an authorized agent for the administration of the General Education Development Tests.

Students under the age of eighteen will not be allowed to take G.E.D. tests except as provided by law. Exceptions include seventeen-year-old individuals with requests from a potential employer, college, or the Armed Services and those within sixty (60) days of their eighteenth birthday.

The G.E.D. tests may be used to assist adult education and continuation high school students in meeting the high school graduation requirements except U.S. History, Social Science requirements.

An adult education fee may be increased only after the appropriate public hearing has been conducted and with Board approval.
