

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is Measure N?

Measure N, a school facilities bond, was approved by Rancho Cordova voters in November 2006. The voters requested that the following needs be addressed:

- Safety and security improvements such as exterior lighting, security equipment and fences.
- Education enhancements, such as computer technology improvements, smart classroom technology, replacement of old portables and library improvements.
- Improved communications, such as parent notification system and digital signs.
- Landscape and learning environment enhancements, such as turf and field renovations and asphalt repairs.
- Student health and recreation, such as playground and PE equipment, additional cafeteria space at CHS.
- Replacement of old furniture and equipment.

Did you know...

- Bond funds can only be used for construction and infrastructure improvements, and not for administrative salaries or school supplies.
- The District saves money by using similar plans for school designs.
- The Facility Master Plan for Measure N was reviewed by the City Council in Dec., 2007 and approved by the Board of Education in Sept., 2008.

MEASURE N OVERVIEW & PROJECTS

In November, 2006 Rancho Cordova voters passed Measure N, a \$125 million school facilities bond for renovation, maintenance, and new construction at existing Rancho Cordova schools. It provides improvements needed to keep pace with newer schools being built in the area.

Individual committees at each school were formed to meet with District administrative staff and architects to define the scope of work needed. Site committee input was used to develop individual architectural plans for each project site. Once architectural plans are approved by the state, the FCUSD is authorized to release requests for proposals and award contracts for construction.

The bond also called for a Citizens Oversight Committee, which has a broad-based membership, to monitor expenditures and the construction progress. All expenditures authorized by Measure N are reviewed by the Citizens Oversight Committee to ensure the money is spent only on school facility improvements, as defined by the bond text approved by the voters.

The committee meets approximately every two months and its meetings are open to the public. Parents and community members are encouraged to attend. Members of the Measure N Citizens Oversight Committee are: Rebecca Budge, Amy Hiramoto, Brandon Ivie, Jenny Jennings, Conrade Mayer, and Josie Steelman, as well as Liaison to Measure B, Craig Osborn.

CURRENT PROJECTS

Mills Middle School: New furniture installation, replace and reconfigure parking lot, replace hard court area, reconfigure entryway into library, administration building upgrade, enhance entry into campus and façade work, digital marquee, new concrete and stage in quad area, and site work to include landscaping, irrigation, and fencing

Cordova High School: Relocation of 14 portable classrooms from E-wing, kitchen remodel in the cafeteria, addition of restroom in the counseling office, and site work to include new water line, utility lines, and irrigation system that services both Cordova High and Mills Middle Schools

Kinney High School: Installation of smart boards

UPCOMING PROJECTS

Cordova High School: Fall 2010—begin construction of 2-story science building in E-wing; Fall 2011—F-wing building reconfigured to house culinary, design, and ceramics.



COMPLETED PROJECTS

Mitchell Middle School: Music room upgrades and new landscaping and field repairs, concrete/asphalt renovations to accommodate ADA accessibility and new fencing.

Cordova Villa Elementary School: Install a new multipurpose building, install a new kindergarten relocatable building; expand the current administrative area, provide upgrades to the grounds and fields, hard court and parking lot areas to provide for ADA accessibility and new fencing.



Kitty Hawk/Mather Youth Academy: Remodel building interiors to provide a new learning resource center, upgrade classrooms, reconfigure parking lot.

Mills Middle School: Gym and shower/locker room renovation including new gym floor, bleachers and new lockers.

White Rock Elementary School: Reconfigure bus drop-off and parking areas; renovate play fields and landscaping, install digital marquee, enhance entry walkways, new basketball backstops and tetherball poles, new library, install video surveillance and exterior lighting, replace old walkways and provide upgrades for ADA accessibility.

All sites: Install smart classroom technology.
