## COMMUNITY

Folsom Cordova Unified School District encompasses an area northeast of downtown Sacramento, California. Its boundaries include the cities of Folsom and Rancho Cordova, both of which adjoin Highway 50, leading east to Lake Tahoe. Folsom High School is located in a community with 81,000 inhabitants. Currently the district consists of 36 schools, including 21 elementary schools, 4 middle schools, 3 comprehensive high schools plus alternative high schools, adult education, and other service centers.

## SCHOOL

Folsom High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school.

- In 2021, Folsom High School received recognition as a California Distinguished School.
- In 2021, Folsom High School was granted a six-year accreditation through the Western Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges.
- In 2016, Folsom High School received the Civic Learning Merit Award from the State of California. The award is given to schools that demonstrate commitment to empower students' knowledge, skills, and interest to participate in democracy.
- In 2014, Folsom High School received the Gold Ribbon Award.

## AP/HONORS COURSES:

It is recommended that students have a 3.0 college prep GPA to take an AP course.
Juniors/Seniors are limited to 6 AP courses per year. Sophomores can take 1-2 AP/Honors courses per year. Occasionally, our master schedule has conflicts that could prevent students from taking the maximum number.
In Spring 2023, 735 students participated in AP examinations. A total of $\mathbf{1 4 5 7}$ exams were taken in $\mathbf{2 5}$ subjects. $\mathbf{8 3 \%}$ of the AP exams received scores of $\mathbf{3}$ or higher. The average test score is 3.6.

Advanced placement courses and Honors (with the exception of Honors English 9 and of Honors English 10) are weighted. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA.
