Background information regarding Jewish-American History Month



Both a Nationality and Religion **Nationality** Religion

Definition of Nationality: the status of belonging to a particular nation

- Jewish nationality is influenced by ancestry, culture, and values.
- Jewish Nationality can be separate from Judaism. The practice is not mandatory to have Jewish nationality.

<u>Definition of Religion:</u> the belief in and worship of a superhuman power

- Judaism has many denominations, from orthodox Judaism, to denominational Judaism, to not recognizing it at all.
- Jewish people who practice Judaism often have deeper ties to the land of Israel because of the significance in the Torah
- Judaism is an ethnic religion in Israel, however not all Jewish folks practice it







Theoretical Physicist

- 1879 1955
- Soon after Adolf Hitler
 became chancellor of
 Germany, Einstein left the
 country and settled in
 Princeton, New Jersey
- 1921: Nobel Peace Prize
 Winner

Ruth Bader Ginsburg



First Jewish woman on Supreme Court

- 1933 2020
- Second woman to serve on the Court
- Social icon, a champion for equal rights, and a historic trailblazer

Betty Friedan



American Feminist

- 1921 2006
- Wrote: The Feminine
 Mystique (1963) which
 explores the causes and
 frustrations of modern
 women in traditional roles
 - Book was an immediate and controversial best seller

Garrett Reisman



American Engineer

- 1968 Present
- First Jewish crew member on the International Space Station
