"A person with a disability is someone who has a long-term, physical, hearing, seeing, cognitive, mental, or emotional impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activity.

The disability population is diverse in terms of disability characteristics (the type and severity of the disability, and the age at which the disability was acquired) and lived experience.

There are between 40-57 million people with disabilities in the United States, which is 13-20 percent of the population."





USING PEOPLE FIRST LANGUAGE CONTRIBUTES TO A POSITIVE IMAGE OF PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

Person with a brain injury	Brain damaged
Person of short stature, little person	Midget, dwarf
Person with a learning disability	Slow learner, retard
Person with mental illness, psychiatric disability	Crazy person, psycho,
Person with spinal cord injury	Cripple
Amputee, has limb loss	Gimp
Nondisabled, person without a disability	Normal, able bodied, healthy

INCLUSIVE INTERACTIONS

ASK BEFORE YOU HELP

Offer assistance only if the person appears to need it or communicates that they need help. If they do want help, ask how they want to be helped.

DON'T MAKE ASSUMPTIONS

People with disabilities are the best judge of what they can and cannot do.

BE SENSITIVE ABOUT PHYSICAL CONTACT

Avoid touching a person's wheelchair, scooter, service dog or cane. People with disabilities consider their equipment part of their personal space.

"HIDDEN" DISABILITIES

Consider that not all disabilities are visible and people may behave in ways that seem uncomfortable to you. This behavior may be related to a disability.

scenes and it is not appropriate to watch the entire film in class.


