
Rabbit <u>makes</u> his bed <u>by a log. The home of a fox is next to the log.</u>




Old Rabbit naps <u>on the</u> grass <u>by</u> the log. <u>He gets</u> c<u>old</u>.



Rabbit thinks, "I <u>can</u> fix this." <u>He</u> <u>gets out the</u> box <u>of candles</u>.


He puts all six candles on top of the log. He gets a match from his bag.

Old Rabbit <u>gets</u> up <u>and</u> runs. <u>He</u> thinks Fox will catch him.


But Fox <u>is</u> stuck in <u>the</u> wax. <u>He</u> will not <u>have</u> Rabbit <u>for</u> lunch.



Riff <u>finds</u> Ann <u>under the</u> box. <u>He finds</u> Sam <u>by the</u> sticks.




Sam <u>says</u>, "Let's trick him. Let's <u>put some</u> chips <u>and</u> nuts <u>by the</u> shed."




"Riff will <u>go there and</u> will not <u>see</u> us <u>hide</u>." Sam chops <u>some</u> nuts.


"How can he find us?" asks Sam. "I think he can smell us," says Ann.



#### The Jet




<u>I can make a jet out of</u> <u>paper</u>. <u>I fold</u> it <u>on</u> this edge <u>and</u> that edge.

I see it fly over a box and over the shed.


My jet goes down by the grass. I try to jump over it.

Will it hit the wall? No, it just makes it over the top.




Many people try to catch it. The jet flies past them.




Dad <u>said</u>, "Let's <u>go get your</u> mom. <u>She is in the hospital</u>."




Mom <u>was</u> not <u>very</u> sick.

Mom had <u>to have a cast put</u> on <u>her leg. She was all set to</u> come <u>home</u>.


Dad <u>said</u>, "<u>Put on your</u> caps. It <u>is very</u> hot <u>out there</u>."

Mom <u>said</u>, "<u>Where were you?</u> <u>I could</u> not <u>find you</u> in <u>the</u> shed."




"We were on the back steps with Liz," said Ann. "We saw a big bee."

Ann <u>said</u>, "Liz didn't run.


<u>She saw the bee</u> land <u>on</u>

said Sam.




Mom <u>said</u>, "<u>You should</u> not let <u>bees do</u> that. <u>I would</u> run <u>very</u> fast."

Witches do not fly on mops.




Why <u>do</u> Liz <u>and</u> Ann <u>have</u> mops? Well, <u>I</u> will tell <u>you</u> why.

When <u>there</u> is mud <u>on</u> the steps, <u>they come</u> and mop up that mess.




Ann <u>and</u> Liz <u>are good</u> witches. <u>They do</u> not fly up in <u>the</u> sky <u>on brooms</u>.


He did not hunt with the other men. He did not sing at all.



From sunup to sundown he sat on a swing. As he sat, he would look at his ring.





The cat messes up <u>her</u> dress. The <u>woman</u> calls <u>for</u> help.






The thin cat jumps <u>over the</u> lamp. <u>She</u> lands in <u>the</u> fish tank.

#### At the Pond




Ann <u>and</u> Sam <u>go to the</u> pond with Riff. <u>One woman is</u> <u>on the swing</u>.




A big man sits by the ducks. He has some chips. The ducks quack and quack.

The man gives them some chips. They like the chips a lot.




Some other ducks swim over to the man. They quack and quack. They want some chips.



## At the Pond




Riff jumps up <u>and</u> runs <u>toward the</u> man. <u>The</u> ducks flap <u>their</u> w<u>ing</u>s.
