Vocabulary: we learn over over 700 new words in this course. Daily interaction with vocabulary through in class activities and independent learning (quizlet, flashcards, vocabulary lists) makes this easier

(3) GRADING POLICY

Practice - 10%

- Late work accepted for half credit within the unit, up to 1 week past original due date if the unit has ended, but not past the end of a semester grading period.

- No retakes on final exams

(4) EXPECTATIONS

Practice good language-learning habits:
